PREFACE

<u>Preface:</u>

Brief History of the College

The college was established by the then PEPSU Government in 1954 to cater the needs of people of this academically backward area in the field of Higher Education. There was no other Institute at the time of its establishment providing teaching facilities in Arts Science and Commerce Faculties within a radius of 50 Kms. It was one the oldest institutes of the state and was granted permanent affiliation by the Punjab University in 1954. The college has been affiliated with Kurukshetra University for a period of 11 Years then with affiliated to Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak. The college is registered under Section 2(f) &129(a) of the UGC Act (Annexure 11 enclosed).

The College is situated in a pollution free area almost out of the town and spread over an area of 33 acres of land which has been fully developed with greeneries. This College is known for its excellence in the fields of Academics, Cultural Activities and Sports. The aims and objective of this institution is to produce socially responsible, ideal dedicated and disciplined persons in the society. The college was assessed and accreditated by the NAAC team in 2003 with B+ grade College.

1. Curricular Aspects:

The College provides education in Arts ,Science,Commerce, BBA, BCA, B.Sc –Computer Sc. faculties to undergraduate level and English ,Geology, Geography, Maths, Zoology, Botany, Chemistry and M.Com to Post Graduate level. The curriculum of these classes in various subjects is designed and decided by Maharashi Dayanand University, Rohtak comprising of a panel of subject experts, Senior Most Educationists and the Members of Board of Studies in connivances with the guidelines of University Grants Commission.

The syllabi framed by the University is divided in two parts viz theory and Practical separately so that students what they learn in the class room, the knowledge is applied in performing practicals by their own hands to understand the problem. Thus the students develop scientific attitude and knowledge in the concerned field. In the beginning of the session the Talent search Program is conducted to find out the best of talent in students in the field of cultural activities and sports. Throughout the session students are involved in cultural activities like Declamation, Debates, Quiz Contest, Paper

reading contest, Seminars, Essay Writing competition, Group songs, Group dance, One Act Play etc.

The college has play grounds for Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Cricket, Lawn Tennis, FootBall, Archery, Hockey etc. Lecturer in Physical Education guides the students in various sports activities. The students of this college brought laurels in the sports activities on University and inter University level.

2. Teaching learning and Evaluation:

In the beginning of the session students are admitted in first degree level on merit basis as per the number of seats allotted by the Department of Higher Education, Haryana keeping in view the reservation policy of the State Govt. This College provides teaching facilities to more than four thousand students in all the above mentioned faculties. As per the requirements of eligibility to appear in the final examination, the students have to attend 75% of the total lectures delivered both in theory and Practical. The evaluation of students is done on the basis of Class test, monthly test, presentation and assignments etc as suggested by IQAC of the College and finally by the University exam.

The teachers guide the students in class rooms and observe and make suggestions to improve teaching and learning program. The number of teaching days are 180 and working days are 275 as prescribed by the UGC. The evaluation of the syllabic covered by the respective teacher is monitored periodically. A teacher has to teach 24-27 periods per week as per university norms on the basis of Lesson Plan prepared by respective teacher.

This institution cannot recruit staff at its own level. The teaching staff is recruited by the Haryana Public Service Commission and Non teaching Staff is recruited by Subordinate Staff Selection Commission. The College provides opportunities of Orientation and Refresher Courses for teachers to upgrade their knowledge by the permission of the Head of the institution in various Indian Universities and Staff Colleges. Orientation and Refresher Courses are essential for placement of teachers in the Senior Scale and Selection Grade on the basis of their API Score . There is a provision of self appraisal methods while writing Annual Confidential Report of the Teachers. Maintenance of discipline, punctuality, regularity, co-operation, methods of teaching, participation in research activities, attitude towards other castes and communities and participation in College day — to —day activities are being considered for writing of Annual Confidential Reports of the teachers by the Principal.

In sports activities evaluation is done on the basis of participation of students in various sports activities held at College level, Inter College level, University level and Inter

University level. At the end of the session an Annual Athletic Meets of the College is organized every year.

3. Research, Consultancy and Extension:

At present this institute deals with Research Activities and Consultancy on Post Graduate level in the form of Survey and dessertations are submitted by the Postgraduate Students for evaluation. Special Paper of 150 marks has been assigned by the University in M.Sc. Final Classes of all Scienc subjects . How ever extension activities at the College level are being carried out viz. Organization of blood danation camp, NSS camp, NCC camp, AIDS awareness program ,Medical Checkup camp etc. One of the Faculty members of this College has donated Blood 25 time in thes camps and Honoured recently by the District administration on 01/10/2015.

The College has established a counseling Guidance Cell for the students to guide them for their future Career Opportunities/jobs Prospects and Women Cell for Women Empowerment and Self dependent of Women in the society.

4. Infrastructure:

This institute has a qualified staff comprising of 25 Associate professors and Assistant professors on regular basis and 49 lecturers are appointed on Extension basis to run the teaching process of College smoothly. This institution has 16 well equipped laboratories in various departments. It has a separate double story building for library in which 59835 books are housed pertaining to various subjects, Text Books, Reference Books, Biography and Journeals for the use of Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses. About a dozen of daily leading newspapers are available in the reading room of the Library for the benefit of the students. The college has a separate well equipped conference room in the library building to hold seminars etc.

The college thus meets the challenge of augmenting the infra structure to keep pace with academic groth with the assistance of the Govt. and UGC. The college atmosphere is kept beautiful and pollution free by plantation of trees and promoting civic sense.

The college has a Dispensary to meet the urgent timely requirement of medicines by the students in order to maintain their normal health.

The college has a separate Hostel building located in the college campus in which 80 students can be accommodated in the well-ventilated and airy rooms. A SC/BC Cell is functioning in the college under the supervision of a lecturer incharge for the welfare of SC/BC students studying in the college.

This college has traversed a long journey of 62 years and has produced a large number of IAS, HCS, HJS, Professors, Technocrats, Scientists, Teachers, Doctors, Military officer and Politicians.

A- Strength:

The college has traversed a journey of 62 years, it has been making consistent efforts to provide quality education and reap the benefits of latest development in IT sector. Ours is a Government funded college, affiliated to Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak. Teaching and Non-teaching staff members take care of the Lab., Computers and other technical duties also. They also help in the smooth running of the Administrative Machinery of the College. The College provides the following support services to the students. Library, Computer Centre, Dispensary, sports facilities, Grievance Redressal Cell, Vehicle Parking enclosures and Reading Room Cum Girls Common Room. There are various welfare schemes available to the students like "Earn While You Learn", Guidance Bureau, Placement Cell, Tutorial Group, Red Cross, Book Bank etc.

B. Weakness:

The College is situated in the semi urban city of Narnaul while most of the students come from the adjoining and nearby villages. In spite of quite developed transport system, many a times the students find themselves unable to reach College in time or for taking extra classes. Though the College doesn't have the freedom and the resources to appoint and pay temporary staff which sometimes affects the benefits to students adversely. But, still, the College is actively engaged in promoting extension activities.

C. Opportunities:

The college is sensitized to latest managerial concept such as strategic planning, Team Work, decision making and computerization. It is making and efficient internal coordinating and monitoring mechanism, College council and other committees, women cell, Grievence Redressal Cell, Library Advisory Committee, Career Guidance Bureau etc. are providing great inputs for the overall benefit and development of students.

D. Challenges:

The most important challenges ahead are to further make use of the scarce resources available. The College is actively engaged in promoting education through its continuous efforts in the field of Research, Consultancy and Extension activities. Health and Hygiene, Adult Education, AIDS awareness, Social Work, Blood Donation, Environment Awareness are some of the fields where the institution is striving hard to fulfill the demand of time. Our important aim is to limit

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the dropout rate to bare minimum through imparting quality education in spite of it being a rural base institution and above all, the College is continuously aiming to become instrument and successful in playing its rule of spreading quality higher education among the rural folk.



This feedback also comes from the parents in the parent's teachers meetings. The principal at his personal level gets the feedback by visiting the classes and talking to the students. Feedback through questioner suggested by NAAC is also taken and analyzed at the College Council level. Suggestions for further improvement are given due consideration.

1.2 Academic Flexibility

- 1.2.1 Specifying the goals and objectives give details of the certificate/diploma/ skill development courses etc., offered by the institution.
 - ➤ B.A.,B.Sc.,B.B.A.,BCA and B.Com. Courses are offered for the students for jobs in the world market. English language lab has been established to promote communication skills.
 - The institution offers a choice to the students to opt for Humanities, Commerce, Science, Technology and Management as one of the streams of their choice on the basis of subjects taken up to their senior secondary school level examination. Further the choice is available even to select subject combination out of as many as 24 different subjects. This option is exercised on the basis of individual preferences or different streams they plan to join after graduation. In 08 different subjects, PG education is being imparted to the students by this institution. Some students

among them have qualified their NET examinations. All this contributes to the academic flexibility. No self financed program is offered in this institution till date.

Now eligible candidates are verified by the experts on computer. Merit list is prepared on line as per reservation policy of the state and central govt. First merit list of eligible candidates is displayed on notice board of the college. A time of three days is given to verify the documents and submit the fee. If a candidate is not able to deposit his/her fee in due course of time his/her claim for admission is rejected and opportunity is given to the candidate who is next in merit. Three successive merit lists are displayed by the college in duration of fifteen days and all the seats are filled up. If any seat remains vacant even after the completion of admission process which was strictly as per guidelines of affiliated university. Then admissions on such seats are done through the prior permission of the Vice Chancellor of the university latest by the date prescribed by the university. No admission is allowed in mid session of the institute. Still migration of the needy students are possible as per university rules .180 lectures are compulsory for each session and every student has to attend 75% lecture in order to be eligible to appear in his/her semester examination. Guidelines mentioned on page no. 10-16 of admission brochure

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of MDU Rohtak for affiliated colleges are attached in the end of report.

The section in which low merit students are there given special periods to bridge the knowledge gap and to enable them to cope with the other students. Similarly slow learner identified after monthly class test are given special academic care. The differently disabled students are particularly cared for so that they don't have to climb the stairs or change room frequently.
 - ➤ B) Academic Calendar: is prepared by the teaching faculty in the beginning of the session and syllabus is divided term wise. EDUSAT is imparting education for those who opt for it. Experiment learning in the subjects of science is there.
 - > C) Teaching quality: Teaching faculty is appointed by the State Govt. as per UGC guidelines. Teachers on Extension lecture basis are engaged in order to fill all the faculty position as per workload of the subject. About eight faculty members attended different seminars and presented papers in the past years. The professional skill development of the faculty is also managed by higher authorities on state level.
